# **Our History**

Our church began in 1867 as a prayer meeting in the Capitol Hill neighborhood. Over the last century, we have grown from a small group of people to a larger congregation, but we have remained committed to the founding purpose: to establish and maintain a faithful witness to the Gospel of Lord Jesus Christ. Since 1878 our church has been served by a succession of 16 pastors. Our current pastor, Mark Dever, arrived in 1994. His ministry at CHBC has engendered a renewed commitment to the principles of God's Word that were embraced by our founders.



In the Fall of 2020, we began meeting at the Anacostia Park Skating Pavilion due to the

pandemic. While we pray for God to end this pandemic and we long to return to our facilities, we are thankful for God's provision to us through the generosity of the National Park Service and the Anacostia community.

### **Our Ministries**

**Children & Youth:** Right now, children's ministry during our Sunday services are suspended due to COVID-19. Outside of our main service's teaching, we minister to children in two ways:

At Capitol Hill Baptist Church, we treasure our children because "sons are a heritage from the Lord, children a reward from him" (Ps. 127:3).
